**FAMILY ACCOMMODATION**

Family accommodation is proposed adjacent to the new children's hospital on the campus at St. James's Hospital. This will provide essential facilities for parents and siblings of sick children with extended hospital stays to enable them stay together so that they can be with their sick child at what is a very traumatic time for all. This is especially important for families who reside outside of the Greater Dublin Area. The facility is connected to the new children's hospital through a shared basement.

Children's Research and Innovation Centre, is an integral part of the new children's hospital, and will be co-located with the existing academic facilities on the campus at St. James's Hospital.

This maximises clinical linkages and creates a centre of excellence for both paediatric and adult healthcare research on the campus.
