Welcome to Resident Connect '3 month look ahead'
May – July 18.

Construction works on the site of the new children's hospital are progressing well, main construction works such as basement excavation, piling, service diversions and building a utility tunnel for the campus are continuing. The temporary road diversion at the Rialto Gate Entrance has opened successfully and is expected to be in operation for approximately 3 months. The temporary compound at Davitt Road is now operational, the purpose of this compound is to store building materials and to allow for the controlled arrival of materials on the site of the new children's hospital mitigating against potential traffic impacts.

In February 2016, the National Paediatric Hospital Development Board published a special edition of Connect which focussed on the economic and community benefits to be gained from the new children's hospital development. Paediatric Outpatient and Urgent Care Centres at Tallaght Hospital and Connolly Hospital

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Also under construction are two new Paediatric Outpatient and Urgent Care Centres, one at Connolly Hospital and one at Tallaght Hospital.

Works at Connolly are progressing as scheduled, the entire concrete structure is substantially complete, all service diversions have also been completed. Works have commenced on the external cladding and internal stud partitioning, mechanical and electrical works have commenced. The paediatric outpatient and urgent care centre at Connolly Hospital will be operational in the summer of 2019.

Works at Tallaght are also progressing with Decant & Crèche works scheduled to be completed in mid-2018. Main works on the Paediatric Outpatients & Urgent Care Centre is expected to commence in September 2018. The Paediatric outpatient and urgent care centre at Tallaght Hospital will be operational in 2020.
