Welcome to Connect – the Resident newsletter which gives you an update on construction work taking place on the site of the new children's hospital in Dublin 8. Construction work on the new children's hospital is progressing well.

Across the 12-acre site the excavation, piling, and the structural frame to the underground basement for campus wide facilities management, energy centre, and the one thousand space underground carpark is complete and a number of windows have been installed in the hospital. To date, well over one million square feet of slabs have been poured.

To the southwest of the site, opposite the South Circular Road, the frame to the finger blocks containing the outpatient departments, cardiology wards, therapy and play areas are completed. To the Southeast, the structural frame containing Outpatient departments, Radiology, Critical Care, Operating Theatres and a Clinical Decontamination Unit are also nearing completion.



The frame supporting the fourth-floor garden to the south of the building is partially complete and sections of the ward block from level 4 to 6 have commenced. The mechanical and electrical fit out of the basement and plant areas is well progressed with the fit out of the outpatient departments to commence shortly. The north side of the site has generally reached ground level and the north fingers contain the outpatients, parent's overnight accommodation, the school and the public restaurant are at level two. The main campus access road has also been diverted into its permanent position to the perimeter of the site.



Pioneering Community Benefit Programme

driving regeneration in the area surrounding the new children's hospital



The overarching objective of the Community Benefit Programme is to maximise the benefit to the local community from the new children's hospital from the construction phase to being fully operational.

Established 4 years ago, the programme is managed by a full-time The NPHDB is using pioneering methods to ensure that Community Benefit Programme Manager and is led by an Oversight Group chaired by Independent chair.

The focus of an Independent Community Benefit Oversight Group is to:

- maximise employment and training opportunities
- to support local business, particularly small and social enterprises
- to raise aspirations through education
- to build community health and wellbeing.

the local community benefits as much as possible, including innovative 'community benefit clauses' in all project related construction contracts, and 'reserved contracts' for social enterprises. It is one of the first public projects of its kind to use both.

Together with the main contractor BAM, the NPHDB has held two 'Meet the Buyer' events to inform businesses about upcoming opportunities, and BAM has spent €2.5 million to date on local contracts and suppliers.

BAM IRELAND LAUNCHES €500K COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

BAM Ireland Launches €500K new children's hospital Community Benefit Fund. Supports to be made available for education, community projects and arts, sports and culture programmes.

BAM Ireland has recently launched the BAM Community Benefit Fund for the new children's hospital. Main contactor BAM has provided a fund of €500,000, which has been established to provide education bursaries and apprenticeship support, aid various community projects and develop cultural, arts and sports initiatives in the areas close to the site of the new children's hospital during the years 2020, 2021 & 2022.

BAM is committed to promoting sustainability across all aspects of its business. Its key sustainability target is to have a net positive impact on climate change, resources and people. This new fund will help BAM to reach this goal through the positive impact these grants will have on lives throughout the local communities.

BAM, the fund's sole benefactor, has worked

closely with the Community Benefit Oversight Group for the new children's hospital to develop this initiative.

Community based and voluntary organisations located within or working with communities in the Dublin 8 and Dublin 12 areas are encouraged to apply for support through the fund. It is envisaged that the BAM Community Benefit Fund for the new children's hospital will operate until 2022, with the exception of the educational bursaries which will cover four academic years. Grants & Educational Bursary closing date for this year is 31st March 2020.
